Your new membership card

The committee is in the process of producing a lifetime single issue membership card. This will be issued once only instead of every year. The new card, which is designed to last a number of years, will be much more robust than previous cards.

We will remind members at the end of each calendar year that their membership fee is due the following January. This reminder will be included in your normal two monthly bulletin which we send to all members.

This means that when someone has joined and wishes to continue as a member into subsequent years, they need to **validate their membership card annually**. This simply means they pay their membership fee each year either by cheque or by Standing Order. This is no different to the previous system except they do not receive a new card. Your single-issue card is simply validated in our records under your name. It is this basic information we use to check individuals' membership status at any given time.

Your new single issue membership card, which you should retain as long as you are a member, will be delivered to all those who have renewed their membership to date.

How our funds have supported the Gallery

After the disruption caused firstly by the redevelopment of the Hatton Gallery and then by Covid, the Friends have finally been able to meet with senior TWAM managers to discuss our role. At our last committee meeting, we thought it of interest to review our historical relationship with the Gallery and in particular the extent of our financial support.

Although I have limited access to the necessary documentation, it's clear that there has historically been a significant connection between the provision of financial support from the Friends and the privilege of exhibiting in the main gallery. The information I have been able to access suggests that the financial support has not been inconsiderable.

I have been Treasurer since 2009 and during that period we donated £11,923 to the Hatton. The main items were £3000 for conservation, £5000 of matched funding towards the redevelopment project and a donation of £2000 to acquire an art work. The gallery was closed for redevelopment during 2016. No donations were made 2009 and 2010 and none during 2020 or 2021. In effect the matched funding equates to an additional £5000.

In addition, I have been able to access some financial information for the period 2004 to 2008. This indicates that during this period the Friends donated at least £13,169 to the Hatton. The main items identified were: support for an exhibition catalogue (£2000), purchase of a Plan Chest (£4000), support for new lighting (£2000), and acquisition of original prints (£3000).

Conditions of Entry

Hand in day: Saturday 10th September. Between 10.00 and 12.00

Members are invited to enter their recent work to be shown in the **XL gallery** (just inside the entrance to the Hatton). **This is an exhibition for the Friends of the Hatton Gallery only.** However, if there is any non-member you know who wishes to exhibit they have the opportunity to join by paying the appropriate membership fee. Application forms are available in the Hatton reception area or <u>online at friendsofthehatton.org.uk/join-us/</u>.

The following **two-dimensional media** are acceptable - original prints, painting, drawing, photography, but not photographs of your artwork.

GENERAL

Work submitted must not have been exhibited in previous Friends' Exhibitions. Work must be original - commercial multiple reproductions will not be accepted. In order to maintain the gallery's high standard, any work poorly presented will not be accepted.

CONDITIONS

You may submit up to two works. While every effort will be made to accommodate submissions, space limitation may mean that only one of these can be accepted.

We have not set a maximum size, if space is limited this may be a factor in accepting larger works.

There are **no fees or charges** for submitting work to this exhibition this year **but you must be a member of the Friends of the Hatton**

- 1 Selection of works will be carried out by a panel of judges and their decision will be final. The committee cannot enter into any correspondence or discussion regarding selection criteria or the reasons for the non-selection of work
- 2 The deadline for the return of Entry Forms is Saturday 27th August.



Please complete your entry form using block capitals. The information you give will be used for the descriptive labels displayed beside your work.

- 3 Your work must be delivered to the Hatton Gallery on Saturday 10 th Sept between 10.00
- and 12.00 noon. Please remove any protective wrapping etc. We will email you if any of your work is not selected, therefore please ensure that a clear email address is shown on your entry form.
- 4 Works not selected must be removed from the Gallery on **Mon 12 th Sept between 10.00 and 14.00.**
- **5** Please note that this is primarily a selling exhibition and although we would prefer works that are sold to remain in place until the end of the exhibition we would not deny any buyer the opportunity to remove a work at the time of purchase. Arrangements have been made for purchases to be made at the Hatton Gallery in the reception area. **The minimum price to be charged for a work is £45**
- 6 At the end of the exhibition works must be removed from the Gallery on **Sat 24 th Sept between 10.00** and **14.00**.

YOUR WORK

7 Work must be mirror plated for hanging, as in the diagram below. Please ensure that the plates are vertically centred. A label with your name, address, title of work, medium and price (or not for sale) must be attached to the back of each work. Also attach a luggage label with the same information to the side of your work so that it hangs clear.



8 When pricing your work please take into account the Gallery commission of 20%. In addition VAT of 20% will be charged on the commission. So, if your work is sold at £100, gallery commission is £20, VAT on the commission is £4 and the amount the artist receives is £76.

The Gallery has no storage facilities. The Hatton Gallery, and the Friends of the Hatton Gallery accept no liability for loss or damage. Therefore artists are advised to insure their work.
